It is fabulous to see our students out each day practising for the Cross Country which is to be held on May 23rd at 11.30am on the lower field at Nayland College. We are fortunate to have enthusiastic runners and many parents supporting this event by helping out with supervision on the running tracks outside our school gates.

This year our fundraising is going towards landscaping which includes putting Bounce Bark on the senior playground; library books; maths equipment; teaching resources; new furniture and some is allocated to the current building renovations. Thank you for your ongoing support with projects.

From time to time people ask what the school is fundraising for and parents also ask how schools are funded. Schools receive government funding based on a decile ranking. Information from the NZ Census is used by the Ministry of Education to give schools a decile number between 1 and 9. The lower the number, the greater the funding from the government. Our school is a Decile 6 and this year we received \$762,415 of government funding. The Board of Trustees have the final say on how the money is allocated and are guided by staff who identify needs relating to student learning, resources, property, health/safety and personnel. If you would like further information please do come and discuss this with me.
