This week is Te Wiki o Te Reo Maori. There are many opportunities around our school to hear Te Reo Maori being spoken, together with several prompts to support both staff and students. Ask your children what they have learnt to say in Te Reo Maori this week and keep practising at home!

One of our senior students, Mathew has been meeting with me to develop his plan of holding a Mufti Day to support our school family who lost everything in their recent house fire. ## CURIOSITY AND ENGAGEMENT

Last week I attended the Nelson Marlborough Principals Conference at Lake Roto-iti where our main theme was developing curiosity and engagement. Below are some interesting facts.

- Curiosity and engagement underpin all learning.
- Curiosity is a strong desire to know something.
- Children are naturally curious but unless the conditions are right they are not natural thinkers. We all have a responsibility to teach children how to think.
- Social interactions enhance curiosity.
- Teachers and parents can set up conditions to make learners curious.
- We all need to help children be engaged by telling and showing them what engagement is. It is more than paying attention.
- If you are not engaged in a task you don't learn - when engagement is high learning is high.
- Adolescents need sleep to support them to be engaged in learning – lack of sleep is like being drunk for an adolescent.

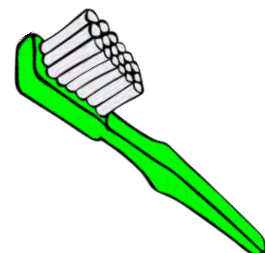
