Cycle and scooter safety is of paramount importance with busy roads together with inexperienced cyclists and scooter users. This week all students have been working with Safe Cycling instructors from Sport Tasman. This is a valuable learning experience and I have been impressed to see some improved hand signalling, traffic watching and use of brakes! These are all good skills for your children to share with you at home and they will certainly benefit from your supporting them by practising the skills out on the road. Remember that we support the guidelines which say that children should not ride on the roads alone until they are ten years old.
