Kia Ora Parents and Whanau

A warm WELCOME to Term 4. I trust that you were able to enjoy some fun family time over the holidays! My thanks to staff who worked during the break to prepare for Term 4 and all the programmes that we will be able to offer, starting with our participation in the Nelson Arts Festival.

On Friday 26 October our Kapa Haka group and the Choir will perform from 12.00-12.30pm at Stage 1 which is being held at the Nelson Centre of Musical Arts in Nile Street. We wish them every success as they showcase the talents of our students.

Then on the Friday night our whole school is taking part in the Masked Parade. This week your children will bring home a permission form for entering the parade and we ask that these are returned asap to allow for smooth organisation. On the form there is a section for parents to indicate if they will be joining us in the parade – if so, please be sure to complete that and organise masks with class teachers.

In Term 4 and Term 1 we implement our No Hat Play in the Shade Guideline. All students are required to wear a brimmed sunhat when outside during the school day. We insist that those who do not bring hats stay in the shade when outdoors. We ask parents to model this Sun Smart behaviour when supporting school activities.

Plans are well underway for the opening of the school swimming complex in early December. As in past years parents are able to hire a key to the complex in late November. This year keys are \$85 and can be paid for at the office - you can also pay this amount off during the term. If you use internet banking keys cannot be sent home with your children as you need to come in to sign the hire form and receive a list of rules. See the notice further on in this newsletter.

Today our school is participating in the Shakeout NZ programme which is aimed at improving student knowledge on what to do in an emergency. Our focus is what to do in an earthquake. Ask your child what our emergency signal for an earthquake is and what they should do. Do you have a home plan for emergencies? You could develop this with your family so they will know what to expect in an emergency!

Our major fundraising event this year is the show 'Nightmare on Nayland' being held at the Broadgreen Intermediate Hall on 27th October and 2nd / 3rd November. So many of you have offered to help which is fantastic and you have also sent along bottles of juice or fizz as well as bags of chips to be sold on the night. All we need now are four more helpers for the show on Saturday 3rd November. WELCOME to Nayland Primary

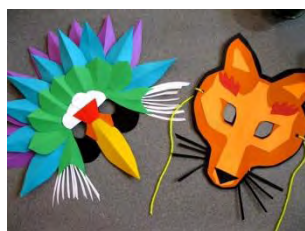
