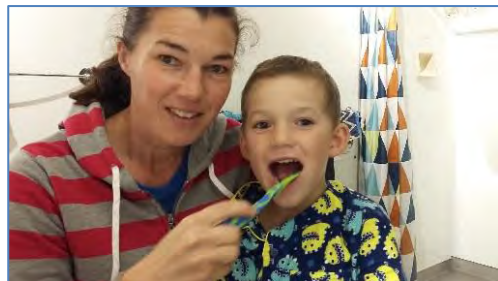
REGIONAL CROSS COUNTRY :
