“Each time a tab is torn from a can and placed in a pocket or a bag, a conscious thought is made to support a sick child.” *The Kan Tab is **A Symbol for Hope**. It is estimated that one tab is worth one second of hope and support for a child waiting for a better chance of life through dialysis or a kidney transplant.*

When you have a beer, a coke or any of your favourite beverages, or open a tin - tear off the tab and save it. Screw tops from wine bottles are also part of this campaign.
