A very warm welcome to Term 3. I trust that you have all had a relaxing and refreshing holiday break! A special welcome to our new families and welcome back to Pam Shaw who is teaching in Room 9. We also welcome Mrs Peggy Meeks who will be teaching in Room 16 this term.

This term has started with interesting lunchtime activities for students based on aspects of Express Me, which is our school wide topic based on The Arts for this term.
