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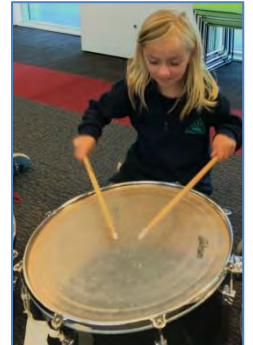

WOW! Amazing! Exciting! I really want to play the drum!! Those were some of the sentiments expressed by students following their attendance at the STRIKE performance on Monday. STRIKE is a percussion group who create amazing music by playing drums and other instruments.



The area outside Rooms 14 – 16 currently in use for construction should be open later next week. The deck roof is going on and the paths are being laid this week. It's really exciting to be near to the end of this project - the decks will be a real asset to class programmes.

It's pleasing to be able to report that the Nelson City Council have acted promptly to make the pedestrian crossing outside our school safer. The trees have been trimmed, one LED light is in place and the other will be installed soon. Improved visibility for drivers will indeed make the area safer!

I often notice students zooming across the road when coming out of the Newlands Walkway which connects Nayland Road to Leicester Street, in line with the pedestrian crossing in front of our school. Drivers are often challenged to see students entering the crossing. I have discussed this concern with Nelson City Council staff and am pleased to let you know that Council staff have investigated the issue; and as a result will be arranging the placement of pedestrian barriers at both ends of the walkway. The aim of these will be to deviate and slow down pedestrians, scooter riders and cyclists, thus giving road users greater opportunity to see and react to these people at the crossing. By installing the barriers our hope is that road safety will be improved for both road users and pedestrians alike. This work will commence soon.

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STUDENT LED CONFERENCES
